



International Funding

Report from the Foundation Center and the Council on Foundations; four of the findings:

- Total amount and average size of international grants is increasing
- □ Most international giving is through U.S. intermediaries
- International giving is becoming more common
- International giving as a percentage of overall giving has remained constant since 2006

Claim your profile Create a profile if one does not exist

Create and save multiple searches



- Read and follow application guidelines
- Look at the website of the funder
- Talk to someone at the agency
- Make sure you have all of the needed information
- Have someone read your application
